
In a country where the word 'period' is still a taboo, a letter celebrating it works like a charm.






A Devotional State


Cinema gives voice to the lower caste .

Jayalalitha was a convent-bred girl who had dreamt of a world of academic and legal studies with an interest in English theatre.

Of course,

She made sure the women in the state had access to education with many of her schemes focusing on empowering women.

Currently, 82.31% of urban and 64.55% of rural women are literate in TN, whereas in a state like Rajasthan, the literacy rate is as low as 57.6%



If the literacy rate of women is so high then what about the working women in Tamil Nadu?





According to the statistics, more percentage of women in the age group 30-49 years are in the workforce rather than 20-29 years old .




